- There are three main (if these are the main reasons what are the rest?) reasons why a zero value transaction may be generated as part of the banking system:
- 7 The transaction has no financial effect (ie a Balance Enquiry or a PIN Change)
- 8 The transaction has been declined by the Bank
- 9, 10 There has been some sort of System Failure. Such failures are normal occurrences. (This is a really poor choice of words which seems to accept that failures in the system are normal and therefore may well support the postmasters claim that the system is to blame for the losses!!!!)
 - Each transaction has associated with it a Response Code <u>field whichfield, which</u> identifies what has happened. These values are included (together with their descriptions) in the <u>ARQs</u>

spreadsheets produced. In summary:

RespCd = 1, means that the transaction was Authorised by the Bank. If it is for zero value, then this means it had no Financial effect. In all the example, such transactions were PIN Changes or Balance Enquiries where this is indeed the case.

RespCd has a value between 2 and 10 means that the transaction was Declined by the BankBank declined the transaction. The actual value indicates why (eg 3 means that the PIN was invalid and 4 means Insufficient funds)

RespCd with a value greater than 10 implies some sort of system failure. The actual value provides further information as to the nature of the failure within the overall system

- 14, 15 From the examples Within exhibits GIJ/1, 2 and 3, the following are the Response Code values that occur explain the reasons for the 'Nil' transactions:
 - 1 Authorised OK
 - 3 Declined Invalid PIN
